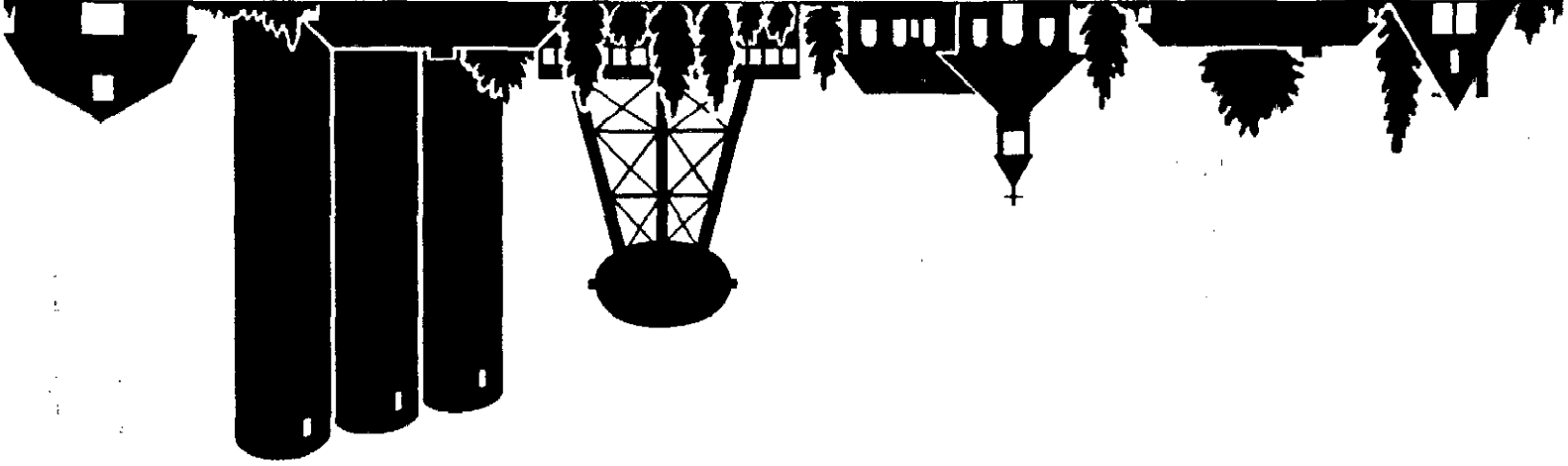

However, the role of the Employment Service is often more complex than simply referring job-ready applicants to existing openings. When jobs are in short supply, E.S. interviewers contact employers in an attempt to locate positions for qualified, available applicants. When job seekers have problems which hinder their employability, the Employment Service provides testing and counseling to help them obtain training and/or employment commensurate with their highest potential.

Unemployment Insurance is an income maintenance program, an insurance payable to unemployed workers. To receive unemployment insurance, a person must be unemployed through no fault of his own, able and willing to work, and actively seeking work. Unemployment insurance is designed to help individuals bridge the gap between losing a job and returning to work.
