

County Park Comparison

Allen County Parks

- Established in 1965
- Supported by county council and city of Fort Wayne
- First land acquisition in 1970's
- Grown to 5 properties and 1100 acres of land
- Funding from all sources including tax dollars.
- Many diverse recreational and educational opportunities.

Fulton County Parks

- Established around 2000
- Grass roots approach supported by citizens
- First land acquired 2005
- Includes 4 properties and about 25 acres.
- Funding from donations, grants, and partnership with IDNR.
- Recreation includes river access, fishing, picnicking, and nature preserve.
